

Pilot Candidate Demographics


Average Years of Experience

More than half—62.5% have a Master's degree or higher




Role

Geography


Pilot candidates represented 19 different countries from every continent except Antarctica.





ATD CI will revise our communications for candidates regarding the estimated amount of time it takes to prepare for the CPTD exam.




 From 80 hours to 80-100+ hours in all official communications.

21 CPTDs spent over 18 hours looking at the pilot test questions and determined difficulty, recommending a cut score

Analysis of the items led to new forms with new pre-testing (beta) items

Survey and focus group results helped to determine any structural changes to the forms



The new forms were re-published in Pearson VUE's system and the cut was applied to all pilot candidates.


Both Pearson VUE and ATD CI performed QA processes to ensure the veracity of scores and the process of scoring was without error.




The actual cut score varies by form and is not publicly released.

The range of scores is from 200 to 800 with 500 as the passing score.

Only those who are unsuccessful receive diagnostic feedback- by domain only.









For the CPTD Pilot, scores ranged from 266 to 748. The average

score was 570.


No one domain stood out as being an area where candidates, on average, performed better or worse.

Performance across domains was similar.



Continuous Improvement

Our commitment to continuous improvement includes **on demand scoring** starting with November window.




Candidates testing remotely receive an email within 2-8 hours with their results.

All candidates can access score reports in the Certification Portal.



Face Value

Candidate Satisfaction



71% were satisfied with their experience

13% were neutral about their experience*

16% were unsatisfied with their experience

^{*} Free form comments included wanting to know their score before deciding satisfaction.

Face Value

68% thought that the exam questions were relevant to their job in Talent Development



67% thought that the <u>content covered</u> is <u>necessary for success</u> in Talent Development

Perceived Difficulty 2%- as expected 34%easier 64%than harder expected than expected

Still, there was a 76% pass rate with the cohort

Continuous Improvement

Our commitment to continuous improvement includes continuously writing and reviewing items for the exam.



The next item writing projects will begin in Q1 2020 and all certified CPTDs are welcome to try their hand at writing items.

Where did people test?



44% tested at a test center



56% tested via remote proctoring from their home or office

Did people like <u>where</u> they tested?



80% were satisfied with the experience



68% were satisfied with the experience

Continuous Improvement

Enhance communications about what to expect as a remote proctored candidate including:



- Step-by-step guide to testing remotely
- Common problems to avoid
- Expanded FAQs

Test Timing

Time Management

74% of respondents reported on the survey they had enough time to complete the exam; however, individual comments from the survey and focus groups indicated the timing may have been off between the MCQ and CMQ sections.



Time Management

Behind the scenes, candidates were actually finishing the multiple choice section with little or no time left versus the amount of time left for the case management section. Some candidates had up to 45 minutes left after the end of the CMQ section.



Time Management

The optional 10-minute break was a welcome addition. Some took advantage of the time to stretch or rest their eyes and many said it was helpful to take the time to re-focus for the next section.



Case Management Questions

Feelings were mixed- some liked them; some hated them

Some thought the instructions were confusing and the order of the sections (MCQs and CMQs) should be flipped.

Most wanted a better understanding of scoring

Bottom line: Candidate Preparation needs to focus on the **ANALYSIS & EVALUATION** of the knowledge in order to do well on the exam.



Continuous Improvement

Starting with the November 18-December 23 window, the timing has been tweaked:



105 minutes to complete 90 MCQs
instead of 95 minutes
and

65 minutes to complete 10 CMQs instead of 75 minutes

The break remains 10 minutes.

Continuous Improvement

We will be updating candidate materials with better communication, including:

Immediate

 An additional screen of re-worded instructions just prior to CMQ section within the exam.

Coming Soon

- A SME-produced video walking a candidate through the thought process of answering a CMQ
- Updated information on scoring of CMQs

Pass rate by region

In accordance with credentialing standards, since the pilot candidate numbers by region were so small, ATD CI will not be assessing the pass rates by region until the numbers grow.



How did people test?



44% tested at a test center



56% tested via remote proctoring from their home or office



Did the location affect test scores?



80%- Test Center pass rate



74%- Remote Proctoring pass rate



Pathway Results

Standard Pathway

250 candidates had standard eligibility



25 candidates were APTDs first



12 candidates earned an ATD Master designation first



Pathway Results

Standard Pathway

75.2% pass rate



88.0% pass rate



83.3% pass rate



More on Scoring

Reliability & Validity are key factors in Certification

Validity- whether the test is measuring what it is supposed to measure

Reliability- how consistently the test measures minimum competence in TD



Scoring-Validity

68% thought that the exam questions were relevant to their job in Talent Development

67% thought that the <u>content covered</u> is <u>necessary for success</u> in Talent Development



Scoring- Reliability

Reliability- how consistently the test measures minimum competence in TD

The two forms of the CPTD Pilot had an Alpha of .90 and .89, scoring Excellent and Good with

internal consistency.

Cronbach's alpha	Internal consistency
α ≥ 0.9	Excellent
0.9 > α ≥ 0.8	Good
0.8 > α ≥ 0.7	Acceptable
0.7 > α ≥ 0.6	Questionable
0.6 > α ≥ 0.5	Poor
0.5 > α	Unacceptable
